1 O LORD, Thou hast ^asearched me and known *me*.

2 Thou adost know when I sit down and when I rise up;

Thou bdost understand my thought from afar.

3 Thou adost 1 scrutinize my 2 path and my lying down,

And art intimately acquainted with all my ways.

4 ¹Even before there is a word on my tongue,

Behold, O LORD, Thou adost know it all.

5 Thou hast ^aenclosed me behind and before,

And blaid Thy hand upon me.

6 Such aknowledge is btoo wonderful for me;

It is too high, I cannot attain to it.

7 ^aWhere can I go from Thy Spirit?

Or where can I flee from Thy presence?

8 aIf I ascend to heaven, Thou art there;

If I make my bed in ¹Sheol, behold, ^bThou art there.

9 If I take the wings of the dawn,

If I dwell in the remotest part of the sea,

10 Even there Thy hand will alead me,

And Thy right hand will lay hold of me.

11 If I say, "Surely the adarkness will loverwhelm me,

And the light around me will be night,"

12 Even the ^adarkness is not dark ¹to Thee,

And the night is as bright as the day.

^bDarkness and light are alike *to* Thee.

13 For Thou didst ^a form my ¹ inward parts;

Thou didst ^bweave me in my mother's womb.

14 I will give thanks to Thee, for ¹I am fearfully and wonderfully made;

^aWonderful are Thy works,

And my soul knows it very well.

15 My ^{1 a}frame was not hidden from Thee,

When I was made in secret,

And skillfully wrought in the ^bdepths of the earth.

16 Thine ^aeyes have seen my unformed substance;

And in ^bThy book they were all written,

The ^cdays that were ordained for me,

When as yet there was not one of them.

17 How precious also are Thy athoughts to me, O God!
How vast is the sum of them!
18 If I should count them, they would aoutnumber the sand.

When ^bI awake, I am still with Thee.

19 O that Thou wouldst ^aslay the wicked, O God;

^bDepart from me, therefore, ^cmen of bloodshed.

20 For they ^aspeak ¹against Thee wickedly, And Thine enemies ² ^btake *Thy name* in vain.

21 Do I not ^ahate those who hate Thee, O LORD? And do I not ^bloathe those who rise up against Thee?

22 I hate them with the utmost hatred; They have become my enemies.

bTry me and know my anxious thoughts;
24 And see if there be any 1 ahurtful way in me, And blead me in the ceverlasting way.
