## **Obey Rulers**

8:1 WHO is like the wise man and who knows the interpretation of a matter? A man's wisdom <sup>a</sup>illumines <sup>1</sup>him and causes his <sup>b</sup>stern face to <sup>2</sup>beam.

**2** I say, "Keep the <sup>1</sup>command of the king because of the <sup>a</sup>oath <sup>2</sup>before God. 3 "Do not be in a hurry <sup>1</sup> <sup>a</sup>to leave him. Do not join in an evil matter, for he will do whatever he pleases." 4 Since the word of the king is authoritative, <sup>a</sup>who will say to him, "What are you doing?"

**5** He who <sup>a</sup>keeps a *royal* command <sup>b</sup>experiences no <sup>1</sup>trouble, for a wise heart knows the proper time and procedure. 6 For <sup>a</sup>there is a proper time and procedure for every delight, when a man's trouble is heavy upon him. 7 If no one <sup>a</sup>knows what will happen, who can tell him when it will happen? 8 <sup>a</sup>No man has authority to restrain the wind with the wind, or authority over the day of death; and there is no discharge in the time of war, and <sup>b</sup>evil will not deliver <sup>1</sup>those who practice it. 9 All this I have seen and applied my <sup>1</sup>mind to every deed that has been done under the sun wherein a man has exercised <sup>a</sup>authority over *another* man to his hurt.

**10** So then, I have seen the wicked buried, those who used to go in and out from the holy place, and they are <sup>a</sup>*soon* forgotten in the city where they did thus. This too is futility. 11 Because the <sup>a</sup>sentence against an evil deed is not executed quickly, therefore <sup>b</sup>the hearts of the sons of men among them are given fully to do evil. 12 Although a sinner does evil a hundred *times* and may <sup>a</sup>lengthen his *life*, still I know that it will be <sup>b</sup>well for those who fear God, who fear <sup>1</sup>Him openly. 13 But it will <sup>a</sup>not be well for the evil man and he will not lengthen his days like a <sup>b</sup>shadow, because he does not fear God. 14 There is futility which is done on the earth, that is, there are <sup>a</sup>righteous men to whom it <sup>1</sup>happens according to the deeds of the wicked. On the other hand, there are <sup>b</sup>evil men to whom it <sup>1</sup>happens according to the deeds of the righteous. I say that this too is futility. 15 So I commended pleasure, for there is nothing good for <sup>a</sup>a man under the sun except to eat and to drink and to be merry, and this will stand by him in his <sup>1</sup>toils *throughout* the days of his life which God has given him under the sun.

**16** When I <sup>a</sup>gave my heart to know wisdom and to see the task which has been done on the earth (even though one should <sup>1 b</sup> never sleep day or night), 17 and I saw every work of God, *I concluded* that <sup>a</sup>man cannot discover the work which has been done under the sun. Even though man should seek laboriously, he will not discover; and <sup>b</sup> though the wise man should say, "I know," he cannot discover.
