

### *The Lord's Supper*

13:1 Now before the Feast of <sup>a</sup>the Passover, Jesus knowing that <sup>b</sup>His hour had come that He should depart out of this world <sup>c</sup>to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them <sup>1</sup>to the end. 2 And during supper, <sup>a</sup>the devil having already put into the heart of <sup>b</sup>Judas Iscariot, *the son* of Simon, to betray Him, 3 *Jesus*, <sup>a</sup>knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that <sup>b</sup>He had come forth from God, and was going back to God, 4 <sup>\*</sup>rose from supper, and <sup>\*</sup>laid aside His garments; and taking a towel, He <sup>a</sup>girded Himself about.

### *Jesus Washes the Disciples' Feet*

5 Then He <sup>\*</sup>poured water into the basin, and began to <sup>a</sup>wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel with which He was girded. 6 And so He <sup>\*</sup>came to Simon Peter. He <sup>\*</sup>said to Him, "Lord, do You wash my feet?" 7 Jesus answered and said to him, "What I do you do not realize now, but you shall understand <sup>a</sup>hereafter." 8 Peter <sup>\*</sup>said to Him, "Never shall You wash my feet!" Jesus answered him, "<sup>a</sup>If I do not wash you, <sup>b</sup>you have no part with Me." 9 Simon Peter <sup>\*</sup>said to Him, "Lord, not my feet only, but also my hands and my head." 10 Jesus <sup>\*</sup>said to him, "He who has bathed needs only to wash his feet, but is completely clean; and <sup>a</sup>you are clean, but not all *of* you." 11 For <sup>a</sup>He knew the one who was betraying Him; for this reason He said, "Not all of you are clean." 12 And so when He had washed their feet, and <sup>a</sup>taken His garments, and reclined *at the table* again, He said to them, "Do you know what I have done to you? 13 "You call Me <sup>a</sup>Teacher and <sup>b</sup>Lord; and <sup>1</sup>you are right, for *so* I am. 14 "If I then, <sup>a</sup>the Lord and the Teacher, washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. 15 "For I gave you <sup>a</sup>an example that you also should do as I did to you. 16 "Truly, truly, I say to you, <sup>a</sup>a slave is not greater than his master; neither *is* <sup>b</sup>one who is sent greater than the one who sent him. 17 "If you know these things, you are <sup>a</sup>blessed if you do them. 18 "<sup>a</sup>I do not speak of all of you. I know the ones I have <sup>b</sup>chosen; but *it is* <sup>c</sup>that the Scripture may be fulfilled, "<sup>d</sup>HE WHO EATS MY BREAD HAS LIFTED UP HIS HEEL AGAINST ME." 19 "From now on <sup>a</sup>I am telling you before *it* comes to pass, so that when it does occur, you may believe that <sup>b</sup>I am *He*. 20 "Truly, truly, I say to you, <sup>a</sup>he who receives whomever I send receives Me; and he who receives Me receives Him who sent Me."

### *Jesus Predicts His Betrayal*

21 When Jesus had said this, He <sup>a</sup>became troubled in spirit, and testified, and said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, that <sup>b</sup>one of you will <sup>1</sup>betray Me." 22 The disciples *began* looking at one another, <sup>a</sup>at a loss *to know* of which one He was speaking. 23 There was reclining on <sup>a</sup>Jesus' breast one of His disciples, <sup>b</sup>whom Jesus loved. 24 Simon Peter therefore <sup>\*</sup>gestured to him, and <sup>\*</sup>said to him, "Tell *us* who it is of whom He is speaking." 25 He, <sup>a</sup>leaning back thus on Jesus' breast, <sup>\*</sup>said to Him, "Lord, who is it?" 26 Jesus therefore <sup>\*</sup>answered, "That is the one for whom I shall dip the morsel and give it to him." So when He had dipped the morsel, He <sup>\*</sup>took and <sup>\*</sup>gave it to Judas, <sup>a</sup>*the son* of Simon Iscariot. 27 And after the morsel, <sup>a</sup>Satan then <sup>b</sup>entered into him. Jesus therefore <sup>\*</sup>said to him, "What you do, do quickly." 28 Now no one of those reclining *at the table* knew for what purpose He had said this to him. 29 For some were supposing, because Judas <sup>a</sup>had

the money box, that Jesus was saying to him, “Buy the things we have need of <sup>b</sup>for the feast”; or else, that he should <sup>c</sup>give something to the poor. 30 And so after receiving the morsel he went out immediately; and <sup>a</sup>it was night.

**31** When therefore he had gone out, Jesus <sup>\*</sup>said, “Now <sup>1</sup>is <sup>a</sup>the Son of Man <sup>b</sup>glorified, and <sup>c</sup>God <sup>1</sup>is glorified in Him; 32 <sup>1</sup>if God is glorified in Him, <sup>a</sup>God will also glorify Him in Himself, and will glorify Him immediately. 33 “<sup>a</sup>Little children, I am with you <sup>b</sup>a little while longer. <sup>c</sup>You shall seek Me; and as I said to the Jews, I now say to you also, ‘Where I am going, you cannot come.’ 34 “A <sup>a</sup>new commandment I give to you, <sup>b</sup>that you love one another, <sup>c</sup>even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. 35 “<sup>a</sup>By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another.”

**36** Simon Peter <sup>\*</sup>said to Him, “Lord, where are You going?” Jesus answered, “<sup>a</sup>Where I go, you cannot follow Me now; but <sup>b</sup>you shall follow later.” 37 Peter <sup>\*</sup>said to Him, “Lord, why can I not follow You right now? <sup>a</sup>I will lay down my life for You.” 38 Jesus <sup>\*</sup>answered, “Will you lay down your life for Me? Truly, truly, I say to you, <sup>a</sup>a cock shall not crow, until you deny Me three times.
