Ministers of a New Covenant

3:1 ARE we beginning to acommend ourselves again? Or do we need, as some, bletters of commendation to you or from you? 2 "You are our letter, written in our hearts, known and read by all men; 3 being manifested that you are a letter of Christ, 1 acared for by us, written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone, but on tablets of 2 human hearts. 4 And such aconfidence we have through Christ toward God. 5 Not that we are adequate in ourselves to consider anything as *coming* from ourselves, but acquacy is from God, 6 who also made us adequate as asservants of a hew covenant, not of the letter, but of the Spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life. 7 But if the aministry of death, hin letters engraved on stones, came with glory, so that the sons of Israel could not look intently at the face of Moses because of the glory of his face, fading as it was, 8 how shall the ministry of the Spirit fail to be even more with glory? 9 For if the ministry of condemnation has glory, much more does the ministry of righteousness abound in glory. 10 For indeed what had glory, in this case has no glory on account of the glory that surpasses it. 11 For if that which fades away was was was was was in glory, much more that which remains is in glory.

12 ^aHaving therefore such a hope, ^bwe use great boldness in *our* speech, 13 and *are* not as Moses, ^awho used to put a veil over his face that the sons of Israel might not look intently at the end of what was fading away. 14 But their minds were ^ahardened; for until this very day at the ^breading of ^cthe old covenant the same veil ¹remains unlifted, because it is removed in Christ. 15 But to this day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their heart; 16 ^abut whenever a man turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. 17 Now the Lord is the Spirit; and where ^athe Spirit of the Lord is, ^bthere is liberty. 18 But we all, with unveiled face ^abeholding as in a mirror the ^bglory of the Lord, are being ^ctransformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as from ^dthe Lord, the Spirit.
